

JUNE JOBS REPORT STRONGER THAN EXPECTED

Healthcare employment added 39,000 jobs in June, continuing a steady upward trend. Ambulatory services and hospitals saw the strongest gains, contributing to the overall 147,000 rise in nonfarm payrolls. Employment Situation Summary June 2025 | US Bureau of Labor Statistics
